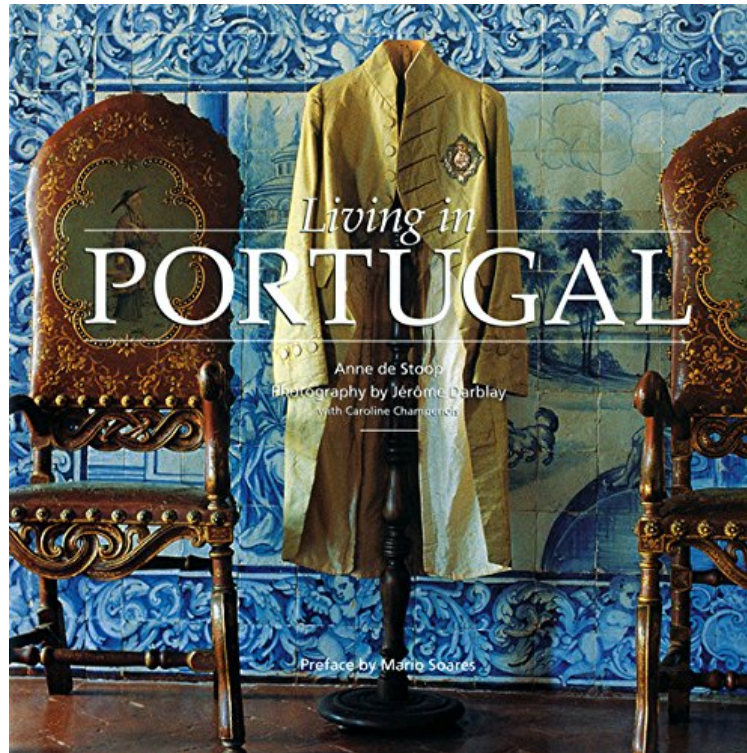

unspoiled beaches of the Algarve.
