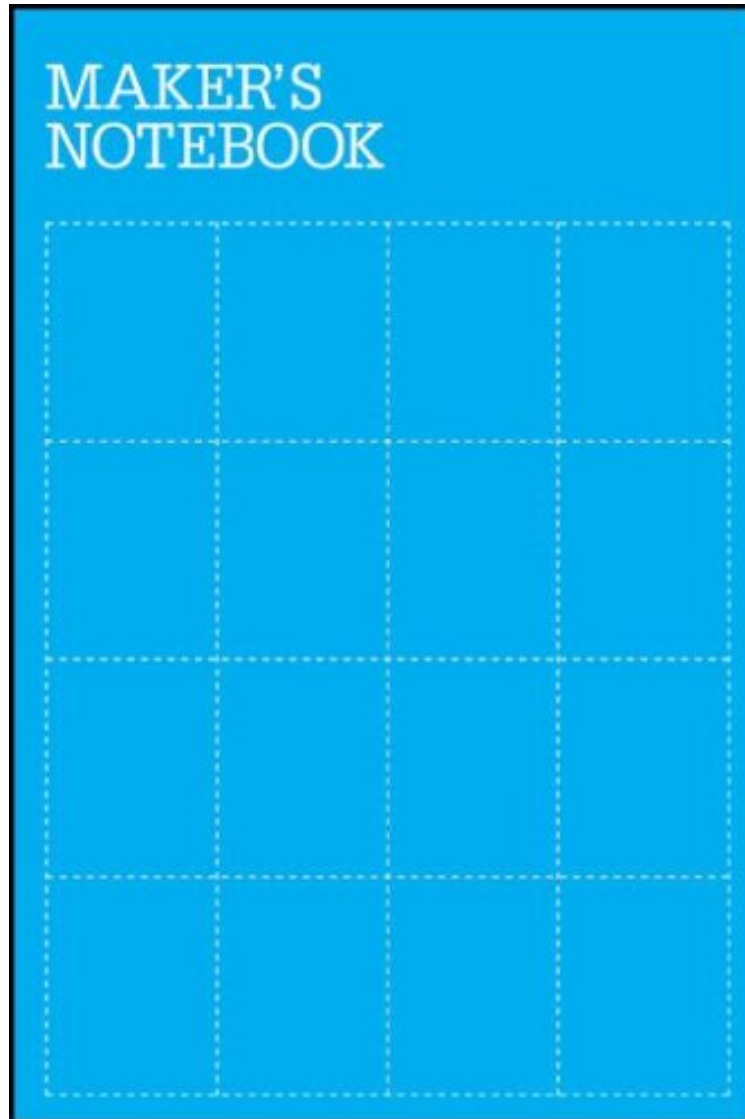

Here's my unbiased review: This is the greatest notebook that you could ever buy. I have never had any issues with this seller, and every package that I have received has been in pristine condition and arrived exactly on time.Let's start from the outside. The notebook itself measures roughly 6.25" x 9.25" x 0.625" (159mm x 235mm x 16mm). The cover is a standard hardcover that's wrapped in the nice, smooth blue

material that you see in the picture. The same material is continuous around on the spine and over to the back cover of the book. The dashed grid graphic on the front cover is mimicked on the back as well. There is a white block on the spine of the book; the area is there so you can title the notebook, write your name on it, or even leave it blank. There's also a red elastic band attached to the back cover that wraps around the notebook to keep it closed. There is also a tassel attached to the book to act as a bookmark so you know where you left off. Opening the book, on the inside of the cover you'll find a lot of different graphics printed. There's also a ruler [in metric (cm) and standard (in)] printed on the sides of the pages with those graphics. There's a page in the beginning that will let you record: "title", "volume", "date", "in case of loss, please return to:", "name", "address", "city", "state", "zip", "land", "mobile", "email", "website", and "as a reward: \$". There is also two pages reserved for use as a table of contents. The main pages of the notebook are incredible. The pages are printed with dual grids. The smaller grid may be a little small for writing for some people, but I found it works just fine. Every page is already numbered, and the number is printed in the header block. Also in the header block, you can record: "idea/project", "date", "notes/sig", "from page", and "to page". There are 146 pages in total for you to fill up with whatever you can dream of. However, the content of this notebook doesn't end on page 146. Now, you think that would be it, but there's more. On the inside of the back cover, there is a built in pocket for loose notes and such. Included with every notebook in this pocket are three sheets of cool stickers. Yes, COOL stickers. There are some hazard stickers, some object stickers, some funny stickers. Some stickers can be useful for things you may be designing in your notebook. Some stickers simply promote the manufacturer (Make:). All in all, this is without a doubt one of the best notebooks I have ever had. I have already transitioned to only using Maker's Notebook. The price on the back cover states that this sells for \$19.99 regularly. If you see posting it for anything equal or less than that, definitely buy one! A mechanical pencil is a great addition to this book as you can secure it using the red elastic that's used to keep the book closed. I find myself taking all kinds of notes in the book and taking it with me on the weekend to the hardware and electronics store. Stickers are a plus. Hardcover is sturdy without making it weigh much. There is also a pouch on the back page which I use to store a small ruler. It's become my own personal reference library for circuits, diagrams, pinouts, and measurements.

As a long time Moleskine user, I'm preferring the Maker's Notebook because...- it has the page marker, elastic band to hold it closed, and the back pocket.- unlike the Moleskine, it has pre-numbered pages, a spot to put the project name, the date- they have a few index pages in the front set aside for listing pages of important contents- the grid lined pages are great for writing and diagraming Cool too they give you some fun stickers to put on the cover and spine
