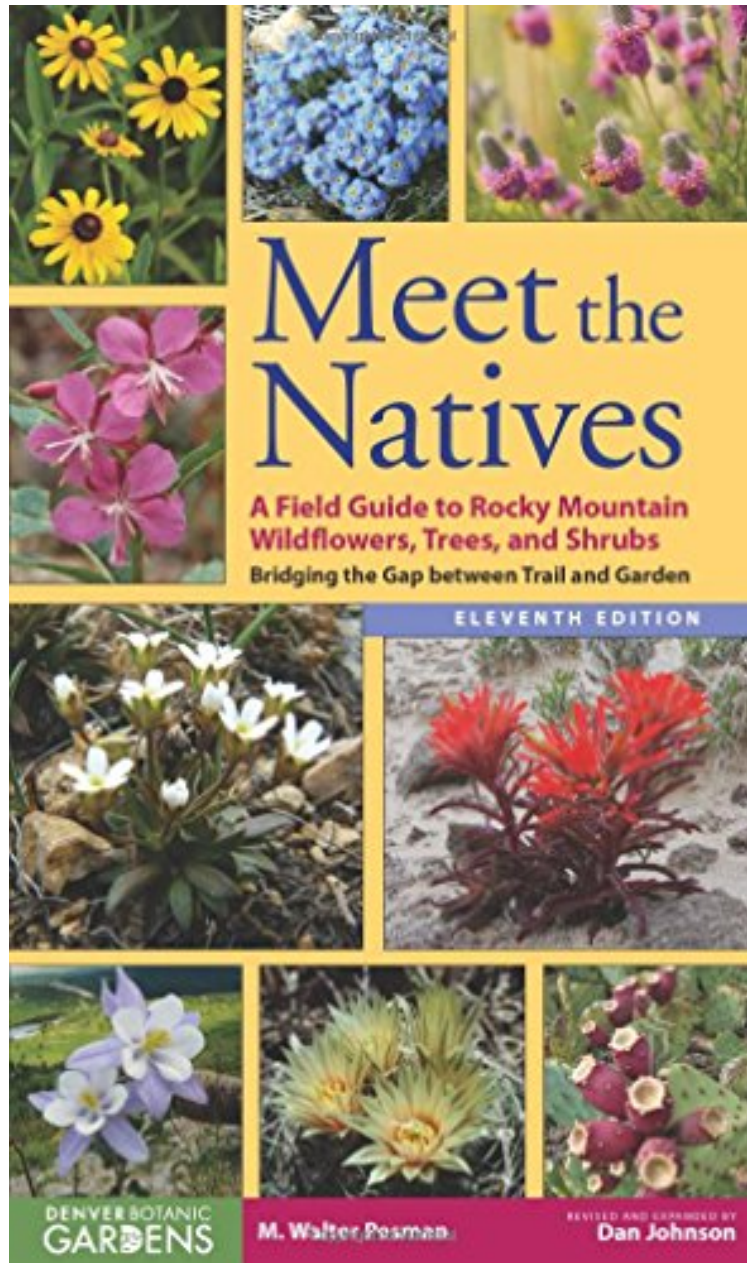

If you hike or travel in Colorado and want to identify a plant or flower, this is your book. It is organized by flower color (what a wonderful idea) instead of genus/species like most plant books, so novices can very quickly find a plant. It is not a replacement for something like Weber, but most people don't key out plants. If you want to take it hiking I recommend taking it to someplace like Fedex office and have them spiral bind the book so the pages lay flat.
