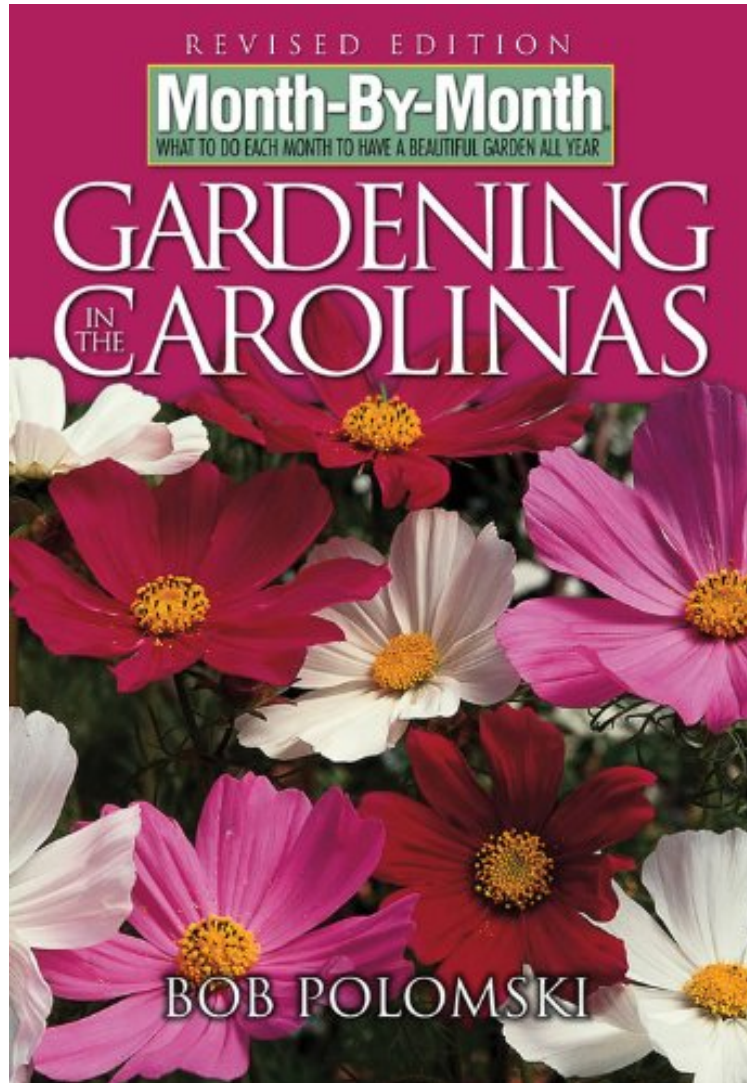

That's a LOT of info! I agree that the format is convoluted, requiring you to go from chapter to chapter to figure out any one month's list of what to get, do, and expect. So if you had this book at a garden center and wanted to go through a "to-do list" you'd have to find the current month under each of the 10 categories that pertained to your landscape and

garden. FYI: those chapters, each having a full year going month-by-month are: 1) Annuals and Biennials, 2) Bulbs, 3) Herbs and Vegetables, 4) Lawns, 5) Perennials, 6) Roses, 7) Shrubs, 8) Trees, 9) Vines and Ground Covers, and 10) Water Gardening. Plus some extra info before and after the chapters. I am glad I have it, but will buy it again when and if they revise the info, with each month being a chapter and each chapter having lists of the ten categories. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. The SC climate is nothing like the Texas climate I moved from! This book helped me keep up with the tasks at hand in a timely manner. I really appreciate the detailed instruction; my only negative note is the division of the book into plant categories (shrubs, fruits, vegetables, trees) with related calendars rather than integrated calendars. To be clear, one turns to shrubs first (for example) then finds the monthly calendar with tasks to do. I would rather have a January calendar, for example, that shows the tasks to accomplish that month for all plant categories. But, that's just my preference. Otherwise, the information is accurate and usable. (Since buying this book I've achieved my SC Master Gardener Certification from Clemson)
