It's an excellent field guide, with descriptions and photos and line drawings of every berry I've ever seen here plus a lot of others. Not just the edibles, not just the most

common or obvious, but everything. It covers SE Alaska, most of the Yukon, all of BC, WA, OR and ID, and parts of Montana, Alberta, Wyoming, Nevada and California. There's a simple key at the beginning to help you ID the berry plant in question. There's a description of how the Indians used the edible ones, and how they're used now - pie, fresh, wine, whatever, as well as what wildlife might eat them. And it's a small lightweight book, easy to carry into the field.

Wild Berries contains a simple key and nearly 100 magnificent colour photographs to guide you quickly to berry identification. Additional notes on how early Indians valued berries and where and when to collect them make this book an indispensable tool.
