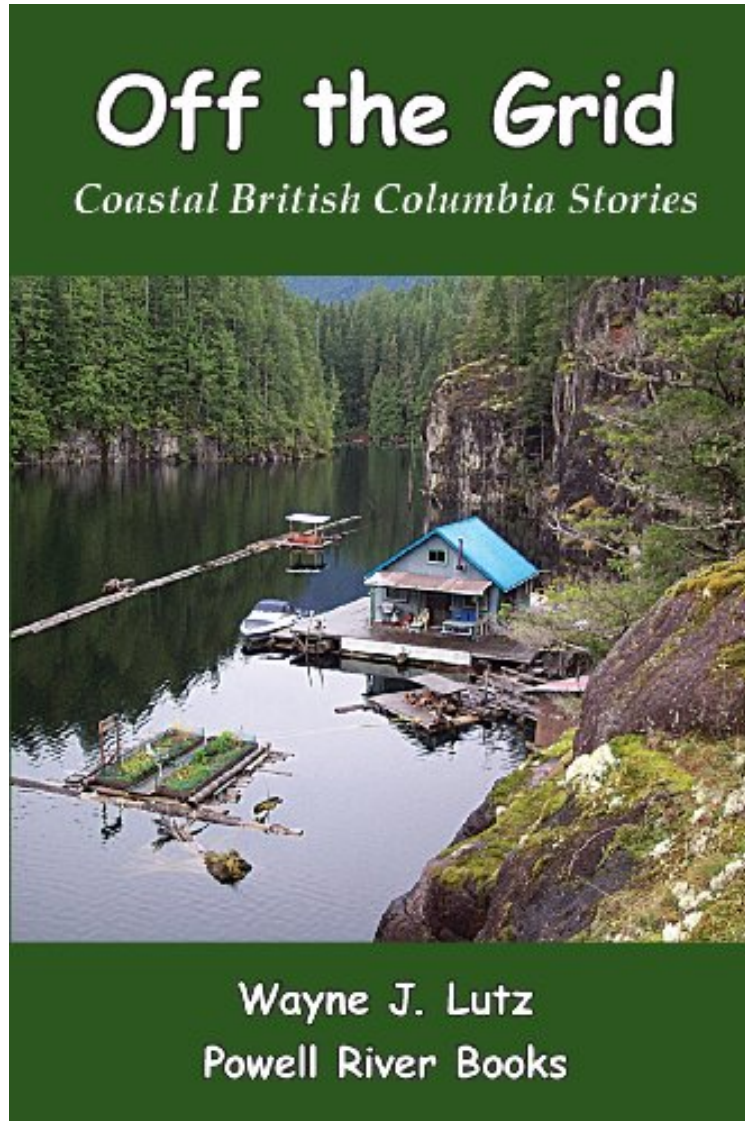

Up the lake and off the grid - Canada at its best. What's it like to live in a remote setting, and how do you get started? The ideal book for those new to off grid lifestyles, providing a realistic look at the experience of remote living.

From the Author My first book in the series entitled 'Coastal British Columbia Stories' was another off-the-grid volume called 'Up the Lake.' After this book, I added 9 additional books to the series (so far), and each of them has a taste of off the grid lifestyles. For readers wanting to know about remote living, I'd recommend 'Up the Lake' and 'Farther Up the Lake,' although I hope you consider reading all 10 books in this series. I've lived in a remote (water access only) location since 2001, and I find it a comfortable lifestyles in all seasons. Powell Lake, BC (my home) is so deep that it never freezes, so I can make the 30 minute trip from town by boat even in the winter. About the Author My background in off-the-grid living began very basically. That is, I knew almost nothing about remote living until I took on the challenge in 2001. My Canadian friend, John, helped me get started, and he has become the focus of most of my books. Through his guidance, I've developed off-the-grid skills in a wonderful learning environment. All of us (except those extremely mechanically-inclined) need a 'John' in our remote living lifestyle, at least to begin our adventure. The good news is that remote regions have an abundance of these highly-skilled individuals, if you look around. Ask other locals for recommendations regarding how to find someone like John, and you'll never regret it.
