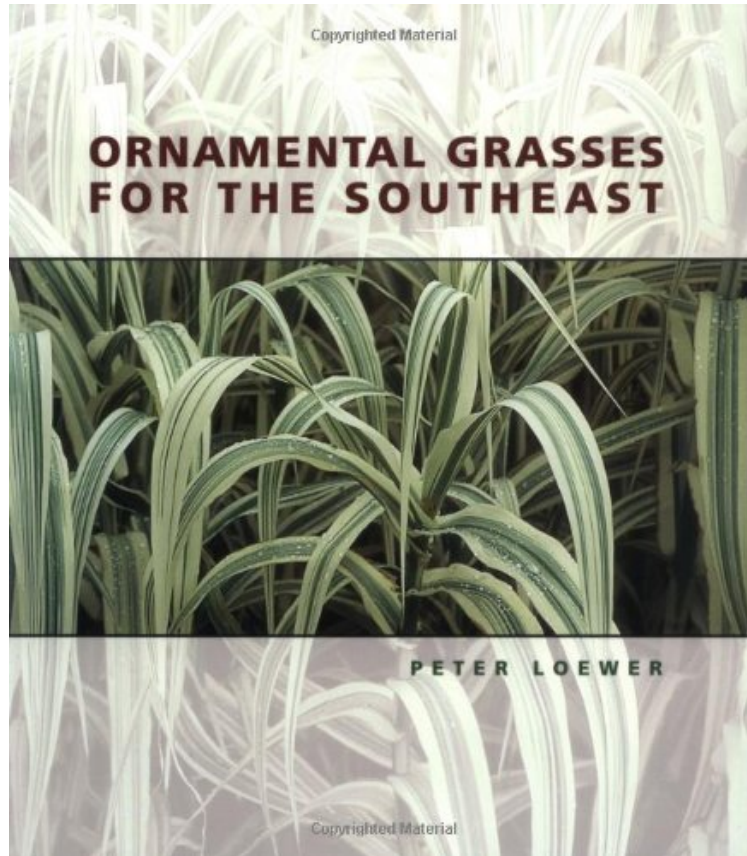

The author describes over 125 varieties of annual and perennial grasses as well as bamboos, sedges, rushes, horsetails, and restios. There is also a section called "Plants That Look Like Grasses" that includes plants such as acorus, liriopes, yuccas, etc. Each profile includes a color photo and a detailed description. Introductory chapters discuss the botany of grasses, designing with grasses and growing and care for them.

Ornamental Grasses of the Southeast features traditional and exotic grasses with detailed instructions on plant care,

landscape use, and the distinctive qualities of each variety of grass. In addition, you'll discover the plant's history and enjoy full-color photographs of each, along with selected botanical illustrations.
