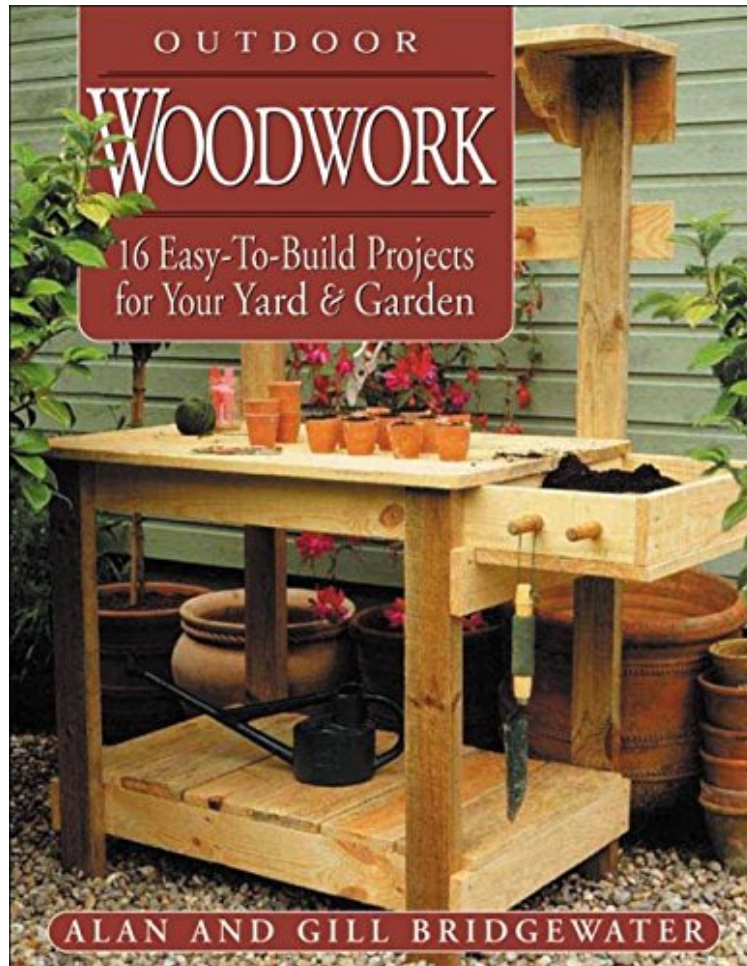

I am impressed by the size and usefulness of the individual pieces, take for example the potting bench which is pictured on the cover of the book. Most potting benches I see that aren't repurposed work benches or workshop tables, are so small as to be of no help at all. You'd almost need to build a second potting bench

to keep the first one alive and on its feet. I want something that will hold pots old and new, buckets of tools and various soil components packed away in tubs.
