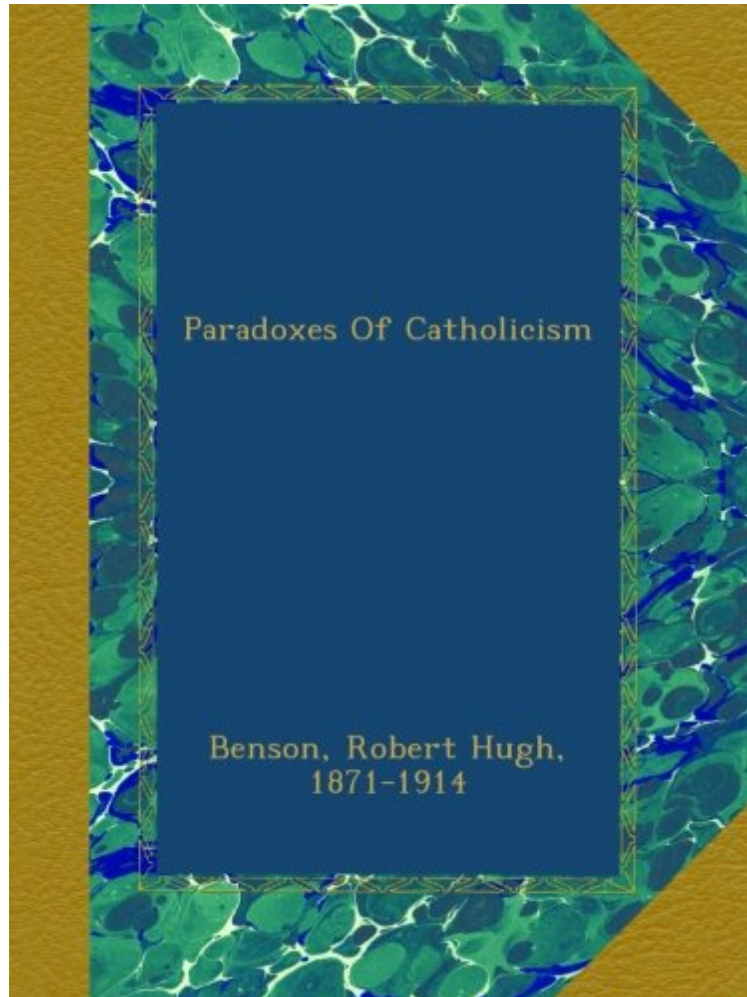

The theme of this short book is one familiar to many Chesterton readers: that people constantly accuse Catholicism of being too extreme in one way AND in its opposite way (for example, too much about following rules, but also willing to forgive anyone any sin at all if n confession). He treats a number of these themes in the first part of the book and ends with a a section devoted to the Seven Last Words of Christ showing that each of them is equally contradictory. The reason, he said, is that the Church is Christ's Church, and Christ is contradictory. His style is clear and often amusing. easy to follow without being glib. I

love apologetics by Knox and Lunn and Chesterton (C.S. Lewis is also in their tradition) and this is just as fine. She is too merciful or too cruel to spiritual for too practical, etc. Benson takes a dozen or so of these arguments head on. His last section which is a meditation on the words of Christ on the cross is worth the (proverbial) price of the book.
