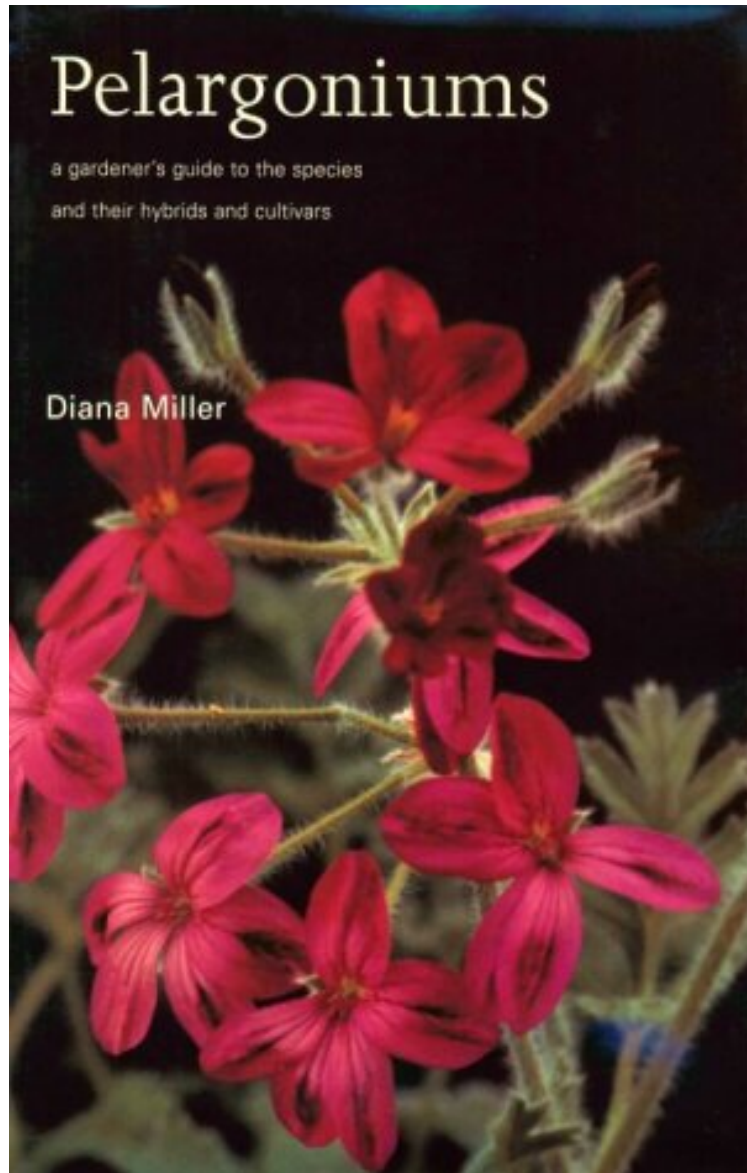

The genus *Pelargonium* was brought to Europe from South Africa in the seventeenth century and now includes more than 200 distinct species. The diversity of its form includes shrubs, annuals, succulents, and tuberous plants. Most of the book consists of descriptions of the species arranged alphabetically with related plants within each botanical section. Miller, a botanist at the Wisley Gardens in England, explains the genus history and discusses its cultivation, propagation, pests, diseases, and disorders.
